



Kriss Warren Enzi

January 5, 1945 - February 13, 2020

Kriss Warren Enzi age 75, of Beach, North Dakota passed away on Thursday, February 13, 2020 at CHI St. Alexius in Dickinson, North Dakota. Visitation will be held from 5:00 P.M. until 7:00 P.M. on Tuesday, February 18, 2020 at the Silha Funeral Home in Beach. Funeral Services will be held at 10:30 A.M. on Wednesday, February 19, 2020 at the Silha Funeral Home in Beach with Reverend David Fisher officiating. Interment services will be held at a later date in Braddock Cemetery in Braddock, North Dakota. Silha Funeral Home of Beach has been entrusted with the arrangements.

Kriss was born on January 5, 1945 in Linton, North Dakota, a son of Herbert and Ethyl (Mandigo). He was raised and educated in North Dakota and following his education he became a dairy farmer in Braddock from 1963 through 1978. In 1978, he worked as an insurance agent for Mass Mutual in Bismarck, North Dakota through 1986 when he moved to Detroit Lakes, Minnesota to help build a golf course while working at Lutheran Social Service counseling troubled children. He and his wife Paula did foster care for twelve years. In 1999, Kriss moved to Washington state working construction through 2006. In 2006, he moved to Beach and worked at various jobs and was employed at Home on the Range for seven years working with troubled youth. He was the past president of Detroit Lakes Foster Care Association.

On June 8, 1966, Kriss married the love of his life, Paula Bierl in Linton. He is remembered for loving life and having a passion for helping children. He loved to travel to various destinations with his family. He very much enjoyed deer hunting in the Black Hills of South Dakota. This last summer, he renewed his wedding vows with Paula.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Herbert and Ethyl; his daughter, Kristy Lynn and his brother-in-law, Ken Ebeling.

Kriss is survived by his wife, Paula of Beach; his children, Randy (Heather) Enzi of Iron River, Michigan and Kriss (Bo) Enzi II of Arlington, Washington; his sister, Adah Ebeling of Cold Springs, Minnesota; three grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
