Patricia Jane Lynch, age 85, of Beach, North Dakota passed on Saturday, March 18, 2017 at the Eastern Montana Veterans Home in Glendive, Montana. Memorial Services will be held at 10:00 A.M. Wednesday, March 22, 2017 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Beach with Reverend Zelwyn Heide officiating. Interment will follow services in the Beach City Cemetery in Beach. Pat was born on May 22, 1931, in her grandmother's house north of Beach, a daughter of Myron S. and Hazel A. (Stedwell) Easton. Pat attended elementary school at Indian Hills School, north of Beach. She later attended Beach High School and received her GED in 1962.

Pat met the love of her life, Thomas Lynch and they were married on November 20, 1948 in Beach. Pat had owned and operated her restaurant called Pat's Cafe from 1968 to 1972. She had also worked at several other restaurants over the years. Pat worked at many jobs over the years to make a living for her family. She was truly "a jack of all trades". In 1973, Pat and Tom moved to Forsyth, Montana where Tom managed the golf course and Pat ran the country club for a time and went on to become a tax assessor in Montana for many years.

In 1988, Pat and Tom retired and moved back to Beach, where she lived and led a busy life. Pat was Mayor of Beach for fifteen years and was very active in everything concerning the city. She was always ready to lend a helping hand where needed. In November of 2016, Pat moved into the Eastern Montana Veterans Home with her husband and lived there until the time of her death. Pat was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church for 50 years. She enjoyed playing cards, dice and dominos. Pat also loved to golf. She enjoyed cooking for her family and one of her favorite things was going on picnics with her family. She was very handy at embroidery and making quilts. Pat made them for all her children and grandchildren.

Pat was preceded in death by her husband; a son, Ben; three brothers, Jim, Clyde and Clifford Easton.
