March 19, 1924 - February 12, 2005

Albert Charles Wicka, age 80, of Beach, died at the Wibaux County Nursing Home in Wibaux, Montana on Wednesday, February 9, 2005. A Vigil Service will be held at 7:00 P.M., Friday, February 11, 2005 in the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Beach. Mass of Christian Burial will be at 11:00 A.M., Saturday, February 12, 2005 at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Beach with Reverend Father David Richter officiating. Rite of Committal will take place at 2:00 P.M. (CST) Monday, February 14, 2005 at the North Dakota Veterans Cemetery in Mandan, North Dakota. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Beach is entrusted with arrangements. Albert was born March 19, 1924 in Wibaux, Montana, the son of Felix and Anastasia (Turzinski) Wicka. He was educated in rural Wibaux County schools and graduated from Wibaux County High School with the class of 1942. Albert farmed with his brother Herbert until 1944 when he entered the United States Army. Albert served in the Pacific Theater of World War II and was honorably discharged in 1946. Albert came home to the family farm and farmed until moving to California in 1948. He returned to Beach in 1951 and was married to Marlyn (Marli) Stecker at St. John's Catholic Church in Beach on June 25, 1952. Albert worked at the Servicenter Service Station in Beach from 1951 to 1966. In 1966, he became the manager of the NAPA store in Beach. Albert retired in 1986. Albert returned to the soil in the form of three huge gardens after his retirement. He also loved playing cards, fishing, boating and woodworking in the winter. He was a life member of the Elks, and a member

of the DAV, American Legion and the VFW. He was a volunteer fireman for many years and served as a church usher as long as he was able to. Albert was preceded in death by three brothers and four sisters. Albert is survived by his wife Marli of the family home; three sons, Kirk Wicka of West Palm Beach, Florida, James Wicka and his wife Ramona of Bismarck, North Dakota and Scott of Beach; two daughters, Elaine Begger and her husband Alan of Beach, North Dakota and Sandi Peplinski and her husband David of Wibaux, Montana; one sister, Vera Covell and her husband Edgar "Stub" of Sand Creek, Michigan; 15 grandchildren and 8 great grandchildren.
