Wibaux, Montana: Alfred J. Nunberg, 80, of Wibaux, Montana, passed away on Thursday, May 28, 2009 at Holy Rosary Healthcare in Miles City, Montana. Nunberg, the son of Alfred A. and Victoria (Mogielnicka) Nunberg, was born on the Nunberg family homestead in Wibaux, MT on May 15, 1929. He graduated from Wibaux County High School in the class of 1947 and spent his entire life in Wibaux on the farm, except for the years he proudly served as a Sergeant in the United States Air Force in Texas and California from 1948 until his honorable discharge in 1955. Fred married Shirley Lutts Lindstrom on November 2, 1967 after meeting at his 20th class reunion. They danced to their song, "Alley Cat," and the rest is history. Fred took over the Nunberg farm and ranch and raised a family as well as cattle, sheep, hogs, llamas, peacocks, and small grains. A fisherman at heart, Fred also enjoyed stargazing, watching birds, and other flying objects. With his eye for nature

and as a natural born artist, Fred painted the scenes of the west with his oils. In recent years, he enjoyed visitors and stories from around the world at the Nunberg N-Heart Ranch Bed & Breakfast with his wife. Fred was heavily involved in his kids' activities as well as active in the ASCS Committee, Knights of Columbus, and was one of the first Eucharistic Ministers at St. Phillip's Parish, where he was a lifetime member and sang in the choir. He was a loving husband, father, grandfather, uncle, and friend. He was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Tony and Casey; four sisters, Helen, Rose, Hattie and Cecilia.
