Anna Lowman, age 95, of Dickinson, North Dakota, formerly of Sentinel Butte, North Dakota passed away on Tuesday, March 11, 2014 at St. Benedict's Health Center in Dickinson. Anna attended a dance in Medora where she met her future husband, Harold Lowman. They were married on November 7, 1940 at St. Bernard's Catholic Church in Belfield. Together they moved out to the Lowman Family Ranch in the Westerheim Community, northeast of

Sentinel Butte. Anna was a member of St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Beach, a 4-H leader for thirty-eight years earning her diamond pin, she was on the township election board for several years and the Friendly Neighbors Home Makers Club. She was an avid letter writer and would keep in contact with all of her family. Anna was a hard working ranch wife, a true help mate to her husband. She always raised a large garden and was an avid canner. She received blue ribbons for many years at the county fairs for her homemade bread, canning, crafts and gardening. She was wonderful and generous with her crafts such as knitting and crocheting. Anna was very soft spoken, kind with her words and always had a word of encouragement for everyone.
