



Ardyn Ardyl Mattson

April 12, 1929 - February 4, 2017

Ardyn Ardyl Mattson, age 87, of Dickinson, North Dakota, formerly of Beach, North Dakota, passed away in Dickinson on Saturday, February 4, 2017.

Ardyn was born on April 12, 1929 in Eureka, South Dakota, a daughter of Fred Thurn and Magdalene (Bietz) Thurn. She was raised and educated in Wishek, North Dakota graduated from Wishek High School with the class of 1947. She then attended NDSU and graduated with a degree in Home Economics education in 1951. While in college, she met the love of her life, Walter Mattson. They were married in Wishek on July 20, 1952.

After college, Ardyn taught Home Economics in Harvey, North Dakota for one year. Walter and Ardyn then moved to Beach where she taught Home Economics at Beach High School, pausing only to raise her family. After they were older, she went back to teaching in Beach for many years and then she substituted.

In later years, Ardyn loved to travel with Walt to see her children and grandchildren. She was a member of the First Lutheran Church in Beach where she was very involved in teaching Sunday School, the bell choir, arranging flowers for the sanctuary, cooking and serving funeral dinners and all other types of food at the church. Ardyn was also very involved in WELCA at her church and was a big supporter and worked at the Badlands Ministry Bible Camp in Medora. She loved quilting and spent many hours at the church sewing quilts together.

Ardyn was very community minded and worked at promoting and entering the

Golden Valley County Fair, a member of Copper Kettle Homemakers Club. She was also very helpful with the Golden Valley County Museum and the library.

Ardyn was preceded in death by her husband Walt, her parents, an infant sister and her son-in-law Carl Monson.

Ardyn is survived by her two daughters, Karen (Rick) Thompson of Dickinson and Karla Mattson of Bottineau, North Dakota; her son, Kent (Sharie) Mattson of Carrington, North Dakota; her sister-in-laws, Lois Dalthorp of Billings, Montana and Sandra Mattson of Eugene, Oregon; her grandchildren, Erica Thompson, Evan (Heather) Thompson, Brandon Mattson, Taylor (Sheena) Mattson, Erin Mattson, Maggie Mattson, Zack Monson, Alicia Monson and two great grandchildren, Parker Mattson and Laiken Mattson.
