November 12, 1915 - June 6, 2015

Beatrice Elise Kalloch, age 99, of Glendive, Montana, passed away on Saturday, June 6, 2015 at the Glendive Medical Center in Glendive. She worked with her brother for forty-one years until retiring in 2001.

Beatrice enjoyed playing cards, dancing and traveling to Norway, Panama,

Costa Rica, Hawaii, Alaska and she went on several cruises. She was very talented in embroidering fine lines which she shared with family and friends. She loved spending time with family and friends. She was a member of the Zion Lutheran Church Women, VFW Auxiliary, Women of the Moose, 4-H Leader, Homemakers Club and Sons of Norway.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Alfred and Jenny; husband, Ralph Kalloch; three sons, Warren, Ed and Mike; one granddaughter; one great-granddaughter; two brothers; one sister; one daughter-in-law; and two sons-in-law.
