



Bernard "Bernie" Hall

March 4, 1914 - October 3, 2012

Glendive, Montana: Bernard Duane Hall, age 98, went to be with the Lord on Saturday, September 29, 2012 at the Glendive Medical Center in Glendive. He followed his wife Mary Lue Hall, his wife of sixty-eight years just twenty-three days after her death. Visitation will be from 3:00 P.M. until 5:00 P.M. and from 6:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. on Tuesday, October 2, 2012 at the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Funeral services will be held at 1:00 P.M. on Wednesday, October 3, 2012 at the First Congregational United Church of Christ in Glendive with Brother Guy Pontoriero officiating. Interment will be in the Dawson County Cemetery in Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive has been entrusted with the arrangements. Bernie was born on March 4, 1914 in Baker, Montana, a son of Rush Jackson and Ethel (Moore) Hall. He was raised and educated in the local Baker Schools. Following graduation, Bernie went to work until he was able to attend college at the South Dakota School of Mines in Rapid City, South Dakota, where he received a degree in Engineering. Bernie moved to Oklahoma after college, where he worked for McDonnell Douglas. While in Oklahoma he met the love of his life, Mary Lue Moser and they were united in marriage in 1944. A daughter, Linda was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Shortly after the arrival of their first-born daughter, they moved back to Montana, where their second daughter, Karen was born. Bernie rejoined Montana Dakota Utilities where he was one of the initial groups of employees to move to Glendive in 1946 and worked in the PT & T Division. Bernie continued his career with Montana Dakota Utilities until

his retirement. Bernie was a man of service. He was a lifetime member of the Elks Lodge, forty-five year member of the Lion's Club and a longtime member of the Congregational United Church of Christ; where he held and performed many duties. He was a member of the Republican Central Committee. He also served a term as a Glendive City Councilman. Bernie was awarded the Melvin Jones and Zeus Award for his community service. Bernie was preceded in death by his parents, Rush Jackson and Ethel (Moore) Hall; his wife of sixty-eight years, Mary Lue Hall; daughter Karen Sue; three brothers, Raymond, Rushmore and Robert Hall and one sister, Beatrice Atkinson. Survivors include his daughter, Linda Matulich of Lone, California; sister, Dorthea Faulkner of Oklahoma; brother-in-law, Robert Gordon (Bobbie) Moser of Sand Springs, Oklahoma whom he considered his half-brother and numerous nieces and nephews.
