



Betty B. Schultz

October 12, 1919 - May 24, 2003

Betty B. Schultz, age 83, formerly of Livingston, Montana, died on Wednesday, May 7, 2003 at the Gilchrist Center for Hospice Care in Baltimore, Maryland, of complications following heart surgery. Memorial services will be held at 2:00 P.M., Saturday, May 24, 2003 at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Glendive with Father Benjamin Lobo officiating. Interment will be in the Dawson County Cemetery in Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive is entrusted with arrangements. Betty was born on October 12, 1919 in Miles City, Montana, to Walton Baker and Ouida Van Dyke Baker. The family moved to Glendive where she attended local schools and distinguished herself as a musician. She graduated from Dawson County High School with the class of 1936 and from the Kinman Business College in Spokane, Washington. Betty worked for the Douglas Meade Company and for the county superintendent of schools in Glendive. In 1942, Betty married William (Bill) Schultz, whose World War II military service began shortly after their wedding. Betty accompanied Bill to several duty stations including bases in California and Texas. Following his overseas deployment, Betty returned to Glendive, where she was employed as a legal secretary in the county attorney's office until the birth of her first child. Bill's railroad employment moved the family from Glendive to Mandan, North Dakota and ultimately to Livingston, Montana in 1967. Following her husband's death in 1987, she continued to reside in Livingston, where she was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church and of the Catholic Daughters of America. In October of

2002, Betty moved to Maryland to be near family. Besides her husband, she was preceded in death by a sister. She is survived by her children, Dick (Karen) of Salem, Oregon, Tom of Brooklyn Center, Minnesota, Diane (Tom) Sooy of Ellicott City, Maryland; and Jack (Danna) of Whitefish, Montana; two sisters, Charlotte (Ed) Roberts and Jean Norman, both of Seattle; her brother, Jack (Pat) Baker, of Glendive; four grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.
