



## Bruce Bruski

August 5, 1946 - March 15, 2007

Bruce David Bruski, age 60, of Wibaux, Montana, died Friday, March 9, 2007, at the Deaconess Billings Clinic in Billings, Montana. Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10:30 A.M., Thursday, March 15, 2007, at St. Philip's Catholic Church in St. Philips, Montana with Father Dennis Schafer officiating. After college, he worked at Medical Lake State Hospital and then served two tours of duty in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. The first tour he worked as an infantry point man and the second tour as a radio operator and an airplane dispatcher. He continued his service in the Army Reserves through 1972. Bruce was active as a Veteran of Foreign Wars member and was most noted for posting flags on Memorial Day and Veteran's Day. Bruce's artistry as a carpenter took him to Hawaii, Florida, Arizona, California, North Dakota and Montana. His attention to detail and creativity can be found in numerous finely-handcrafted pieces of furniture, cabinetry and counters for yachts, building construction, cedar chests, and many other beautiful pieces. He enjoyed gardening, farming, animals and riding horses.

Bruce loved his precious son Aaron, daughter Amber and son-in-law Zeke, long talks to his mom, Betty, on the phone, his best friend and soul-mate Kathy Carr, and his family and close friends. If something wasn't quite right, Bruce was known for striving to fix it when broken. He had a deep respect for the earth and all God's creatures.
