



Clarence "Bud" Nagle

February 13, 1931 - December 28, 2005

Clarence "Bud" Nagle, age 74, of Lindsay, passed away on Friday, December 23, 2005 in Glendive after a short bout with lung cancer. Funeral services will be held at 10:00 A.M., Wednesday, December 28, 2005 at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Glendive with Pastor James Hageman officiating. Interment will be in the Dawson Memorial Cemetery in Glendive with military honors by V.F.W. Post 4813. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive is entrusted with arrangements. Bud was born on February 13, 1931 in Circle, Montana, the son of George and Carrie (Pedersen) Nagle. He attended grade school at Union School and graduated from Circle High School in 1950. Following his graduation from high school, Bud joined the U.S. Army on February 21, 1951 and was stationed in Korea. He was a Sergeant First Class until February 20, 1954 when he was discharged in Fort Lewis, Washington. On July 11, 1951, Bud married Helen Kondelik while he was in the service and stationed at Fort Worden, Washington. They lived in Glendive for a short period after Bud's discharge from the service. They then moved to five miles west of Lindsay where he and his wife farmed and ranched. Bud remained on the farm until the time of his death. Helen preceded him in death on January 11, 2000. Bud loved to hunt, fish and trap. His main love was elk hunting in the fall with all of his friends and family from Wisconsin and North Dakota. When he had time, Bud enjoyed playing cards and watching rodeos. When it came to playing cards, many can vouch for the fact that Bud was hard to beat, and if you did, he would usually say "well if you all are so smart, do you want

to play again?". Bud was a member of the V.F.W. Post 4813 in Circle and had served as Post Commander and District Five Commander. Bud was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers George and Hans.
