



Clarence E. Wolff

March 23, 1912 - January 22, 2007

Clarence Edwin Wolff, age 94, of Wibaux, Montana, formerly of Glendive, Montana, passed away on Wednesday, January 17, 2007 at the Wibaux County Nursing Home in Wibaux. A Vigil service will be held at 7:00 P.M., Sunday, January 21, 2007 in the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 10:00 A.M., Monday, January 22, 2007 in the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Glendive with Father Denis Fournier officiating. Rite of Committal will be in the Dawson County Cemetery in Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive is entrusted with arrangements. Clarence was born on March 23, 1912 at the family home north of Lindsay, Montana, the second son of five boys born to Edwin Adam and Anna Gertrude (Schiller) Wolff. He attended the Spring Creek School located just two miles east of his home. Clarence received his high school education at Dawson County High School in Glendive and graduated with the class of 1931. After graduation he pursued his love of farming with his dad and brother eventually forming Wolff and Sons Inc. In the fall of 1936 when the farming was done he went to work for the Holly Sugar factory in Sidney, Montana. He was employed as a mechanic and worked through nine seasons. The season began in October and continued until the beets ran out in February or March. Clarence returned to the farm in time for spring work. He developed a talent for welding by attending vocational school in Minneapolis in 1940. Clarence met Marjean Lasich in July 1945. They were united in marriage on June 22, 1948 at Twin Bridges, Montana. Their first

home was on the hill above his parents place. In 1946, they bought the Ira Wolff homestead located one mile north of his parents place. They built their home there in 1954 living there until 1967. Clarence and Marjean bought a home in Glendive where they resided until 2001. Clarence was preceded in death by his wife of 53 years, Marjean, in February of that same year. In August of 2001, Clarence moved to the Wibaux County Nursing Home where he resided until the time of his death. Clarence loved his extended family of caregivers at the nursing home and they loved him. Clarence loved farming. He was a very creative thinker and enjoyed developing innovative items that could be used in every day living. Clarence's "love for learning" included reading and studying nutrition. He was passionate in sharing nutritional knowledge with others. Clarence was a member of the Glendive Elks Lodge #1324, had served on the GATE Committee and the Dawson County High School board. Survivors include two daughters, Marijane Pellett of Dillon, Montana and Bonnie Mauch and her husband Dennis of Ann Arbor, Michigan; one son, Bob Wolff of Washington D.C.; six grandchildren, Marc Wolff, Scott Wolff, Brittney Wolff, Darryn Wolff, Matthew Mauch and Hannah Mauch; four great grandchildren, Kayla Wolff, Alexis Wolff, Grant Wolff and Daniel Wolff.
