Billings, Montana: Clifford Conradsen, age 71, of Glendive, Montana passed away on Friday, December 7, 2012 at the Billings Clinic in Billings. Visitation will be from 10:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. on Thursday, December 13, 2012 at the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Funeral services will be held at 10:00 A.M. on Friday, December 14, 2012 at the Evangelical Church of North America in Glendive with Pastor Robert Canen officiating. Interment with military honors will be at 2:00 P.M. on Friday, December 14, 2012 in the Sidney Cemetery in Sidney, Montana. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive has been entrusted with the arrangements. Clifford was born on August 14, 1941 to Einer and Frieda (Bieber) Conradsen in Fargo, North Dakota. Cliff was raised and educated in Sidney graduating from Sidney High School with the class of 1959. While in high school Cliff was active in the Future Farmers of America (F.F.A.). After high school Cliff moved to Glendive where he was employed as a clerk for the Northern Pacific Railroad until he was called to service in the United States Army. Cliff served for two years in active duty and several years after that in the Army Reserves before he received his honorable discharge. Cliff met Helen Leivestad on a blind date in January of 1963 and they were united in marriage on August 25, 1963 in Savage, Montana. After their marriage they resided in Sidney where Cliff worked at J.C. Penney's for a couple of years. He later worked at Thirud Office Supplies as a salesman and as a bookkeeper for Yellowstone Mercantile until 1970 when they moved to Billings. Cliff was a

bookkeeper at the KOA campground headquarters until 1972 when he went to work for Western Oilfield Service. In 1986 Cliff was transferred to Glendive where he continued to work for Western Oilfield Service until 1997 when it was bought out. He then worked in the Prairie County appraisers office in Terry, Montana for one year before he started at the Dawson County appraisers office in Glendive where he worked until his retirement in 2004. Cliff enjoyed reading, woodworking, collecting vintage toy cars and spending time in his shop. He especially enjoyed working on his Ford 9-N tractor and blading the alleyway behind his house. Cliff was very handy and could fix almost anything; he was also a very caring man and put everyone else's needs ahead of his own. He was a past member of the Glendive Noon Lions and received the Melvin Jones Fellowship award in 1998. Cliff was preceded in death by his father; an infant daughter, Cheryl; one brother, Dale Conradsen. Survivors include his wife, Helen Conradsen of Glendive; one daughter, Connie (Wayne) Dahl of Wolf Point, Montana; one son, Del Conradsen of Glendive; four grandchildren, Christina, LaRae, Lindsey and Sarah Dahl; his mother, Frieda Conradsen of Glendive; two sisters, Sharon (Kenneth) Christensen of Glendive and Carol (Stuart) Brodhead of Dickinson, North Dakota and numerous nieces and nephews.
