Clyde Duane Easton, age 78, of Arlington, Washington, lost his battle with lung cancer on Friday December 24, 2004 at his home in Arlington. Memorial services will be held at 2:00 P.M., Saturday, January 15, 2005 in the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Beach with Rev. Warren Maxted officiating. At the time of his death they were living in Arlington, Washington. Clyde was an accomplished carpenter and wood finisher. He worked for Bayliner Boat Co. from building to demonstrating and selling. He had a great zest for life and made friends easily. Clyde always carried his guitar and loved to sing and entertain. He was an avid fisherman and boatman, always looking for that big King salmon. Clyde enjoyed two fishing trips to Alaska in his later years and finally caught his largest King weighing in at 40 pounds, on the Columbia River in Oregon last year. Clyde is survived by his wife Barbara of Arlington, Washington; two brothers, James Easton and his wife Bernadine Easton of

Beach and Clifford Easton of Lees Summitt, Missouri; two sisters, Avis Tilden of Burnsville, Minnesota and Pat Lynch and her husband Tom of Beach; three step-children, Susan, J.J. and John along with numerous nieces, nephews, cousins, great nieces and nephews and a host of friends.
