Lewellyn Dale Hunemuller, age 77, of Glendive, passed away on Wednesday, December 26, 2007 at the Eastern Montana Veterans Home in Glendive. Funeral service will be held at 11:00 A.M., Saturday, December 29, 2007 at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Glendive with Pastor James Hageman officiating. Dale was born on June 16, 1930 in Elliott, North Dakota, the son of Erwin and Nora (McDaniel) Hunemuller. He received his education at Elliott and Lisbon, North Dakota schools. Dale entered the United States Army in January of 1948 and served overseas for three years in Japan and Korea during the Korean War. Following his discharge in January of 1952, he moved to Fargo, North Dakota where he worked for Manchester Cookies. He then operated a gas station in Elliott, North Dakota for two years until he attended the Wahpeton School of Science in Wahpeton, North Dakota, learning to be a bodyman. Dale was united in marriage to Lele Oium on June 6, 1953 in Lisbon, North Dakota. They had 54 ½ wonderful years together and had two wonderful sons, Denis and Gary. Dale and his wife moved to Glendive in April of 1956. He went to work for Urbanec Motors for 33 ½ years, retiring in October of 1989 due to illness. Dale loved his sons and grandchildren very much. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, traveling, playing cards and visiting with friends and relatives. Dale was preceded in death by his parents and two sisters.
