Dennis Ervin Schneider, age 70 of Glendive, Montana and formerly of Beach, North Dakota passed away on Thursday, January 1, 2026 at the Glendive Medical Center in Glendive. Memorial services will be held at 11:00 AM on Tuesday, June 30, 2026 at the Silha Funeral Home in Beach with Pastor Warren Maxted officiating. Please wear Miami Dolphin apparel. Dennis Ervin Schneider was born on September 16, 1955, to Jim and Leila (Simonson) Schneider in Glendive, Montana. Following his graduation, he returned to Beach, where he lived for several years.

Dennis later moved to assisted living homes in St. Paul, Minnesota; Fargo, North Dakota; and Jamestown, North Dakota, where he enjoyed a level of independence and community. In April of 2016, Dennis was involved in a train accident in Jamestown. Afterward, he moved to Glendive Extended Care, where he resided until his passing on January 1, 2026.

Dennis had a deep love for sports and knowledge. He was a devoted fan of

the Miami Dolphins and the New York Yankees and proudly kept sports statistics for many years. He could tell you who won every Super Bowl dating back to the very first one. Dennis also enjoyed video games, trivia, reading books, and a good ghost story. Most of all, he cherished time spent with his nieces and nephews.

Dennis was preceded in death by his parents, Jim and Leila Schneider; his stepmother, Vera Schneider; his niece, Treasure Schneider; and his stepbrother, Spencer Slocumb.

He is survived by his brothers James "Buster," Jack, and Dave (Nadine) Schneider; his sisters Sheryl (Dale) Stansbury, Karen (Darrel) Schmeling, Joanne (Troy) Tescher, Joyce Schneider, and Uncle Ervin Simonson; along with many cousins, nieces, nephews, and great-nieces and great-nephews.
