Donald Wayne Campbell age 89, of Glendive, Montana passed away at his home on Tuesday March 2, 2021. Cremation has taken place and no local services will be held at this time. Silha Funeral Home of Glendive has been entrusted with the arrangements.

Donald was born to his parents Frank and Mary (Allen) Campbell in Lincoln, Nebraska on April 16, 1931. At the age of 12, he was adopted by Meredith and Mary Phillips and raised in Lincoln. He was raised and educated in Lincoln, graduating from Irving High School with the class of 1948. Following his education, Donald enlisted with the U.S. Navy and served four years until he was honorably discharged. During this time, he served in the Korean War. After serving in the military, Donald came to Montana and started working with Northern Pacific Railway for a few years and later working in construction before beginning his career with Mountain Bell Telephone Company. Donald worked all across Montana with Mountain Bell until moving to Glendive in 1964 where he has resided since. He continued working for Mountain Bell until his retirement in 1988.

Donald was united in marriage to Gayle Lovhaug on May 4, 1957 in Thompson Falls, Montana and to this union two children were born.

In his free time, Donald enjoyed golfing, bowling, and singing.

Donald was preceded in death by his parents, his wife Gayle, an infant daughter, Eve.
