



## Dorothy "Dottie" Hunt Davidson

May 12, 1918 - July 10, 2006

Dorothy "Dottie" Louise Hunt Davidson, age 88, of Miles City, Montana passed away at Parkview Caring in Miles City on Friday, July 7, 2006. Funeral services will be held at 11:00 A.M., Monday, July 10, 2006 in the United Methodist Church in Glendive with Pastor T.C. Chatman officiating. Dottie was born on May 12, 1918, at Culp Creek, Oregon, the daughter of Loren Weston and Grace Ellen (Whitlock) Hunt. She grew up in California and spent many summers with her father in Oregon. Dorothy graduated from 8th grade at Marysville Elementary School in Marysville, California, and from Chico High School in Chico, California with the class of 1937. Dottie met Clyde Davidson when he was stationed at the Army Base where she was employed and they were married on June 5, 1943, at Marysville, California. One daughter, Diane, was born to this union. Following Clyde's discharge from the Army in the fall of 1945, they moved to the Lindsay, Montana, area where they farmed and ranched until 1995 at which time they retired and moved to Glendive. In 1998, they moved into the Eastern Montana Veterans Home in Glendive. After Clyde passed away in 2001, Dorothy moved to the McCone County Nursing Home in Circle and then to Miles City in 2002. Dottie was a past member of the Clear Creek Homemakers Club, Summit Homemakers Club, Women of the Moose, and VFW Auxiliary Post #4813. She was content to be a loving wife, mother, and homemaker, and later a proud grandmother and great

grandmother. She loved to cook, do crossword puzzles, read--and go shopping. Little babies, whether they be human or animal, were precious to her. She was a very generous and giving person, always remembering others on their birthdays, anniversaries, and holidays until she was stricken with Alzheimer's disease. She was preceded in death by her husband Clyde; her parents; stepfather, Herbert Sibley, stepmother, Ethel Hunt; brother, John Ashton Hunt; sisters-in-law, Liala Green and May Stortz; and brothers-in-law, John Scheitlin, Delbert Green, George Stortz and Bill Englebright.
