FORT MEADE, SOUTH DAKOTA: Doug M. Carlson, age 83, of Glendive, Montana, passed away on Wednesday, April 14, 2010 at the Fort Meade Veteran's Medical Center in Fort Meade. Visitation will be held from 10:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. on Friday, April 16, 2010, and also from 9:00 A.M. until 12:00 P.M. on Saturday, April 17, 2010 in the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Doug was born on August 2, 1926, in a private home in Flasher, North Dakota the son of Edwin Oscar and Beulah Mae (Sardeson) Carlson. He was raised and educated in Shields, North Dakota. He worked on the family farm and ranch at Shields until entering the United States Navy in February 1946. After his honorable discharge from military service in 1947, Doug returned to North Dakota where he leased a farm in the Shields area. In June 1949, he was united in marriage to Arlene LaDuke in Glendive. They farmed in the Shields area until 1954 when they moved to Intake, Montana where Doug worked as a ranch hand. In 1955, he went to work in the oilfield as a carpenter. In 1957, he was employed by Daniel's Oilfield Service as a roustabout. In 1964, Doug became the manager and part owner of Daniel's Oilfield Service and he and his family moved to

Baker, Montana. They made their home in Baker until 1973 when Doug moved to Glendive where he made his home. Doug sold his interest in Daniel's Oilfield Service in 1978. He worked as a field representative for NALCO Treaters for 3 years and continued working at various jobs in farming, ranching and the oilfield until his retirement in 1986. Doug lived in Dickinson, North Dakota for nearly 20 years with his special companion Angie Chays until her death in 2006. He returned to Glendive in 2007 where he had resided since. Doug enjoyed boating, camping and the Black Hills of South Dakota. He was an avid newspaper reader. Doug especially enjoyed the Intake area along with all of his friends and neighbors there. He always considered himself the "self appointed" Mayor of Intake. He was a member of the American Legion and a past member of the Glendive Moose Lodge. He was preceded in death by his parents; a son Grady in 1977; a sister Virginia; and 3 brothers; Lyle, Eddo and Bernard. Survivors include his daughter, Pam Freier and her husband Dennis; his son Gordy Carlson and his wife Peggy all of Bowman, North Dakota; 5 grandchildren, Kristin West, Jade and Garrett Freier, Eric and Cassi Carlson; 2 step grandchildren, Krista Babeck and Lacey Thielen; 8 great grandchildren; one sister Adele Johnson of Great Falls, Montana; numerous nieces and nephews.
