On December 17, 2007 Earl C. Frank, age 62, peacefully went home in the arms of his Savior, surrounded by his family at Billings Clinic ICU Unit. His dignified and courageous battle against many illnesses was a testimony of his strength to all of us. Earl was born on August 7, 1945 in Bismarck, North Dakota, the son of Phillip and Hertha (Laubenstein) Frank. He was raised in western North Dakota until he was five years old when his family moved to Montana. He attended school in Dawson County and graduated from Dawson County High School with the class of 1963. Earl joined the U.S. Navy in the fall of 1963 and served his country for four years during the Vietnam War. He received an honorable discharge in August 1967. On November 22, 1967 Earl was united in marriage to the love of his life, Linda Thomson. Earl and his wife lived in Glendive until November 1968 when they moved to Denver, Colorado while Earl completed his accounting degree at Parks School of Business. In December 1969, Earl and his wife returned to Glendive where they made their home. Earl was employed by various accounting firms working for Cross Riggs when completing his college degree at Dawson Community College. In

1981, Earl and Linda fulfilled his dream, becoming self employed and establishing Frank Accounting and Tax Service. Last year was his 36th tax season. Earl loved to surround himself with family and friends. He was a strong shoulder to lean on, supportive listener and captured every heart he touched. Some of his favorite things were spending time with his family, especially his grandchildren and going fishing. His fishing travels took him to many breath taking places, yet his favorites were Tobin Lake in Canada and the family cabin at Parshall Bay, North Dakota. Earl was an avid sports fan and faithful Cardinal fan, as well as a supportive spectator for his grandchildren. Earl was a member of Zion Lutheran Church, Vietnam Veterans of America, V.F.W. Post #1125, American Legion, Elks Lodge and Moose Lodge. He was a member of the Montana Society of Public Accountants and the National Society of Public Accountants. Earl was preceded in death by his parents; twin sisters, Gloria Nelson and Gladys Waters; a nephew, Greg; two nieces, Vicki and Cindy; two brothers-in-law, Bob and Jerry; one sister-in-law, Grace as well as many close and dear friends, including his life long friend, Erven Sura.
