Edith attended most of her grade school years in Ulm, Montana, graduating from Great Falls High School in 1949. She attended Northern Montana College and graduated with a two-year teachers certificate in 1951. In the fall of 1951 Edith became the teacher at the Staton Coulee rural school north of Havre, Montana. On March 29, 1952, Edith married Walter Hinebauch, Jr. in Havre. They resided in Havre, farming with Walter's parents until March 1957. They then purchased the

Statelen Farms in Turner, Montana. In August, 1980, they moved to Glendive, Montana, to continue farming, ranching and operating other business interests. Edith was immersed into Christ in 1959. She served in many roles, such as a Sunday School teacher and youth leader at the Turner Christian Church, and also had been involved in various activities at the Glendive Church of Christ. She was a pillar of faith to her family and many friends. Edith thoroughly enjoyed and was very supportive of all her children and grandchildren in all their various sporting events and other endeavors. Edith loved gardening, sewing, cooking and spending time with her children and grandchildren. She was well known for her championship pie and bread baking abilities. Her table was always open to any guests who were in need of a home cooked meal! From their hunting and cattle drive businesses she developed friends world wide. She was preceded in death by her parents and one grandson, Shane Hinebauch. She is survived by her husband, Walter, of nearly 60 years.
