



## Ethel Lohse

March 18, 1918 - November 8, 2004

Ethel M. Lohse, age 86, of Glendive, passed away on Wednesday, November 3, 2004 at the Glendive Medical Center. Funeral services will be held at 10:00 A.M., Monday, November 8, 2004 at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Glendive with Pastor Howard Schreibeis officiating. She also worked as an inspector at "Lunders" in Glendive who provided canvas canteen covers for the military during the Vietnam War. Her husband preceded her in death in 1998. Ethel was a woman of great Christian faith. She was a devoted mother who enjoyed her grandchildren. Ethel's hobbies included reading, handiwork and cooking. She loved her doll and teddy bear collection and her Dachshund animals. She was preceded in death by her parents; three brothers and three sisters. Survivors
