January 1, 1921 - April 19, 2004

George P. Stortz, age 83, of Lindsay, passed away on Wednesday, April 14, 2004 at the Horizon Hospice Home in Billings, Montana. A Vigil service will be held at 6:30 P.M., Sunday, April 18, 2004 at the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 10:00 A.M., Monday, April 19, 2004 at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Glendive with Father Joseph Ponessa officiating. Rite of Committal will be in the Dawson County Cemetery in Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive is entrusted with arrangements. George was born on January 1, 1921 in Glendive, Montana, the son of Theodore and Lena (Dalsasso) Stortz. He attended Bickness Grade School and graduated from Dawson County High School in Glendive with the class of 1938. George worked for the Agriculture Adjustment Act through the ASC Office from the fall of 1939 until the spring of 1940. George was united in marriage to Lulu May Davidson on June 19, 1947. They farmed and ranched together north of Lindsay until May's death in September of 1982. George continued farming and ranching until he became ill in March of 2003. He was selected in 1975 as the Outstanding Conservation Farmer of the Year. George was a member of the Glendive Moose Lodge #949, Sacred Heart Catholic Church, Knights of Columbus, Montana Sheriff's and Peace Officers Association and was a school board member for District 91 (Bickness and Highpoint). George enjoyed breaking horses, playing the accordion at country dances, doing farm chores, and attending rodeos. George was preceded in death by his parents; his wife,

May; his sister, Ethel Wolff and an infant son, George Charles.
