GLENDIVE, MONTANA: George Albert Zody, age 87, of Glendive, passed away on Tuesday, February 24, 2009, at the Glendive Medical Center surrounded by his family. Visitation will be held from 10:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. on Friday, February 27, 2009 at the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Funeral Services will be held at 2:00 P.M. on Saturday, February 28, 2009 at the Evangelical Church of North America in Glendive, with Pastor Robert Canen officiating. Interment will follow in the Dawson Memorial Cemetery of Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive has been entrusted with the arrangements. George was born on September 25, 1921, in rural Dawson County, the son of Cecil Harold and Ruth (Moore) Zody. George attended the Pleasant Plains school through the 8th grade and graduated from Dawson County High School in Glendive with the class of 1939. George accepted the Lord in his early teens and was baptized in the creek east of his home. He later reaffirmed his faith in the Lord when a former pastor returned to have revival meetings at the South Valley Church. George was united in marriage to June Grigsby on April 5, 1941 at the South Valley Fundamental Church parsonage in rural Dawson County. Together they farmed 11 miles northeast of Bloomfield until moving to Glendive in 1986. While farming, George also worked in the Jake Albrecht Coal Mine from the 1940's into the 1950's and for three years he and Alois Hafele ran the mine. He also worked for the Triple A, measuring wheat. George retired from farming in 1991. George was a member of the South

Valley Fundamental Church which he helped build. He later became a member of the Bloomfield Alliance Church, where he served as Sunday School Superintendent. Following his move to Glendive, George attended the Evangelical Church of North America. George served as a trustee and clerk at the Pleasant Plains Rural School while his children attended school there and had also served as director of the Bloomfield Farmers Union. George is preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Harold and Artis; one daughter-in-law, Ruth Zody; two sons-in-law, Melvin Steward and Joe Kelly; two brothers-in-law, Darrell Peck and Phil Dobson. George is survived by his beloved wife of 67 years, June of Glendive; six daughters, Linda Eaton and her husband Elner of Glendive, Rhonda Bornholtz and her husband John of Woodward, Oklahoma, Kathy Lafond and her husband Bill of Glendive, Sheryl Johnson and her husband Roy of Glendive, Valerie Maus and her husband Jim of Plentywood, Montana, Susan Edwards and her husband Bill of Lindsay, Montana; three sons, Larry Zody of Culbertson, Montana, Steve Zody of Nampa, Idaho, Mark Zody and his wife Anita of Glendive; one sister, Iris Dobson of Billings, Montana; 24 grandchildren; 40 great grandchildren with an expected new arrival in April 2009 and numerous nieces and nephews.
