Hal Neumann of Terry, Montana, passed away in his sleep Tuesday morning, November 21, 2023. The cause was colon cancer that had spread to his liver. Hal had been quite ill for a long time, more so than he would admit to himself, until it could not be ignored. Hal wanted to write this good-bye himself, and he would have been much more eloquent than my clumsy words. You may not have known this about Hal, but he was shy, and so was discriminating in his friendships. I am so sorry he couldn't tell you this himself, but he loved each and every one of you. That said, for me his wife, Hal, was the best twenty-five years of my life, and he will be greatly missed by many. Hal wasn't religious in any sense, but if I could define what heaven for Hal would be, it would be to be remembered fondly.

Hal Walter Neumann, born May 11th, 1954, in Miles City, MT to Kathrine Jane Neumann of Alzada, MT and Herbert Hi Neumann of Miles City. Graduating from Custer County High School, Hal worked construction and oil field seismography. A serious workplace accident led him to continue his education at the University of Montana, a master's degree in history and a career as a research historian. Hal met Susan Edwards in 1998 and together they moved to King Salmon, Alaska where Hal took the position of Registrar for the Lake and Peninsula School District. Hal and Susan retired in 2018 and moved to Terry, MT. Hal enjoyed gardening, fixing up the home they owned, corresponding with friends, and as a voracious reader, having the time to read.

Hal is survived by his wife, Susan Edwards of Terry, MT, brother, Wade Neumann of Circle, MT, his aunt, Marjorie Pontius of Miles City, numerous cousins, and innumerable friends.

Per Hal's wishes, cremation has taken place and no services will be held.
