



Harry "Red" Hayden

May 30, 1926 - November 9, 2013

Harry "Red" Hayden, age 87, of Belgrade, Montana formerly of Beach, North Dakota passed away on Monday, November 4, 2013 in Belgrade. Visitation will be from 10:00A.M. until 2:00 P.M. on Saturday, November 9, 2013 at the Beach Community Center in Beach. Funeral Services will be held at 2:00 P.M. on Saturday, November 9, 2013 at the Beach Community Center in Beach with Pastor Scott Hojnacki officiating. Harry "Red" Hayden was born on May 30, 1926 on the family farm near Carlyle, Montana, a son of Charles and Estella (Blake) Hayden. He was raised on the farm and attended school at the school house on the hill near the farm. On his eighteenth birthday Red enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in Butte, Montana and was inducted on June 19, 1944 in the Marines, Company C 26th Marines, 5th Marine Division. During his time in the military during World War II he was in the 3rd wave of marines that landed on the beaches of Iwo Jima where he spent a full thirty days. Two years later he was honorably discharged after ending his tour in Hawaii. Following his time with the military he returned back home to help his father with the family farm and also began his trucking career. While back home he met Wilma Brockmeyer and they were later married in 1949 and to this union six children were born, four boys and two girls. Together they raised their family until the late 1980's when Red moved to Belgrade. While living in Belgrade he married Luella Wyckoff in 1992. They

made their home in Belgrade until the time of his passing. As a boy Red discovered his love of flying and in the mid-70's he decided to make his dream a reality and earned his private pilot's license. He enjoyed being able to fly his family around the country. Red also loved attending auctions, purchasing a great deal of tools and equipment over the years for his business. Red was preceded in death by his parents, Charles and Estella Hayden and one nephew, Charles. Red is survived by his wife, Luella of Belgrade; six children from his first marriage, Larry Hayden of Belgrade, Rod Hayden of Belgrade, Lorayne (David) Leastman of Carpenter, Wyoming, Darrell Hayden of Carpenter, Dale (Linda) Hayden of Bozeman, Montana, RaeAnn (Glenn) Magyar of Honolulu, Hawaii; one brother, Harold Hayden of Beaverton, Oregon; eleven grandchildren, Marcia, Ami, Adellas, Wallace, David John, Emily, Nathan, Jeremiah, Amanda, Jacob and Keaton; twelve great-grandchildren, Jessica, Jennifer, Kayla, Hadley, Montana, Mikaela, Samantha, Dakota, Patricia, Shiloh, Sebastian and Sheldon and two nieces, Kathy and Joan.
