



## Hazelle E. Kaul

January 2, 1919 - February 19, 2010

GLENDIVE, MONTANA: Our beloved mother, grandmother and friend, Hazelle Elizabeth (Voss) Kaul passed away on Saturday, February 13, 2010. Visitation will be held from 1:00 P.M. until 5:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. on Thursday, February 18, 2010 and 9:00 A.M. until 1:00 P.M. on Friday, February 19, 2010 in the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Funeral Services will be held at 2:00 P.M. on Friday, February 19, 2010 at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Glendive with Pastor James Hageman officiating. Interment will follow in the Dawson Memorial Cemetery in Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive has been entrusted with the arrangements. Hazelle was born on January 2, 1919 on the family homestead in rural Dawson County to Gust J. and Wilhelmina (Minnie) Volpp Voss. She was the eldest of three children: Hazelle, Gertrude and Eugene. Hazelle was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith of the First Lutheran Church in Circle, Montana. She attended Sioux Creek rural school and graduated from Circle High School with the class of 1936. Hazelle graduated from Billings Normal School in 1938. Next to her children and her grandchildren, teaching was her life! Before her marriage Hazelle had taught at the Kinsey School in rural Dawson County, Cat Creek rural school in Petroleum County, Crow Agency Montana and Washington School in Glendive. Hazelle was united in marriage to Christ Kaul on June 30, 1946. Following their marriage they farmed on the Buffalo Rapids Irrigation Project on Cracker Box Route in rural Dawson County. This union was blessed with two children: Dara Ann and

Steven Dale. After the untimely death of her husband on September 25, 1959, she moved with her children to Glendive. Hazelle returned to teaching where she taught fourth grade at Lincoln School in Glendive for 23 years. She retired in 1983 after teaching a total of 33 years. She touched the lives of many children! Hazelle was a member of Our Savior Lutheran Church where she was involved with Sunday school for several years. Upon retirement she volunteered with the Glendive Hospital Auxiliary. Hazelle enjoyed traveling with her friends. Her favorite highlight of one of her trips was seeing the Statue of Liberty. Hazelle is to be remembered for her strong faith in God, devotion to her family and coming to the aid of several elderly members of her family and neighbors as well as her strong endurance in facing life's adversities. She was preceded in death by her husband, Christ; her parents and one brother, Gene. Survivors include, her daughter, Dara (Gary) Fladmo of Billings, Montana; her son, Steven (Debbi) Kaul of Glendive, three grandchildren, Erin Fladmo, Erik Fladmo and Shelbi Kaul; her sister, Gertrude Lokken of Sidney, Montana; two step-granddaughters, Daci Overby and Darcell (Jeff) Unterseher as well as numerous nieces and nephews.
