



Isadora "Dora" Bostyan

March 15, 1921 - September 7, 2004

Isadora "Dora" Bostyan, age 83, of Golva, North Dakota, died at the Wibaux County Nursing Home in Wibaux, Montana on Saturday, September 4, 2004. Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 2:30 P.M., Tuesday, September 7, 2004 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Golva, North Dakota with Rev. Fr David Richter officiating. A Vigil will be held at 7:00 P.M. on Monday, September 6, 2004 at the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Beach, North Dakota. Dora was born March 15, 1921 on the family homestead south of Golva, North Dakota, the daughter of Peter and Eva (Prouse) Weinreis. She received her elementary education at the Hillside School near Golva, North Dakota and graduated from high school at the Golva High School. After graduation she worked at the Johnstone Memorial Hospital in Beach as a Nurses Aid. She went on to attend the Loma Linda University in Riverside, California receiving a Bachelors degree in Nursing in 1943. After college Dora went to work at Behrens Memorial Hospital in Glendale, California, as Supervisor of Surgery. Dora met a hockey player named Joseph Bostyan while ice skating and they were married on May 26, 1948 in Beach, North Dakota. They moved back to the family farm south of Golva in 1950, where Joe farmed and Dora worked with Dr. Clarence Bush in Beach. Dora was an avid bowler. She enjoyed playing cards with friends, teaching her children to play base ball and spending weekends with her family at Oddlands Dam. She enjoyed traveling having visited Europe, Hawii and many places in the United

States. Dora was preceded in death by her parents; one son John Roger Bostyan; three brothers, Lloyd, Lyle and Clyde Weinreis; one sister, Evelyn Golde and one nephew Robert Weinreis. Dora is survived by her husband Joe of the family farm South of Golva; two sons, Richard Bostyan and his wife Charlene of Golva, North Dakota and Michael Bostyan and his wife Cheryl of Westminster, Colorado; four daughters, Eva Lou Bostyan of East Grand Forks, Minnesota, Joanne Geinert and her husband Tim of Nortonville, North Dakota, Valerie Whetter and her husband Steve of Maple Grove, Minnesota and Vicki Braden and her husband Brad of Wibaux, Montana; one Sister, Violet Schmeling of Golva, North Dakota and 13 grandchildren.
