28, 1991 in Bozeman. They moved to Beach in 1993 where he resided until the time of his death. Jim and Carolyn currently own and operate The Backyard and had previously owned and operated the Beach Dairy Queen, Bowling Alley and various other business ventures in Beach. Jim enjoyed riding his Harley Davidson motorcycle, fishing, hunting, golfing, bowling and shooting pool. He loved playing poker.
