Jean Antoinette Schulte, age 69, of Glendive, Montana, passed away on Saturday, February 7, 2015 at St. Vincent's Healthcare in Billings, Montana. A Vigil Service will be held at 7:00 P.M. on Wednesday, February 11, 2015 at the Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. A Memorial Mass will be held at 10:00 A.M. Thursday, February 12, 2015 at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Glendive with Father Francis Schrieber officiating. Rite of Committal will be held in the St. Mary's Catholic Cemetery in Golva, North Dakota. Silha Funeral Home of Glendive has been entrusted with the arrangements.

Jean was born on December 25, 1945, in Beach, North Dakota, to Francis "Frank" and Marcella "Sally" (Theisen) Bares. She was raised and educated in Beach graduating with the class of 1963. Following graduation, Jean attended college at Dickinson State in Dickinson, North Dakota graduating with the class of 1967. She received her bachelor's in Elementary Education, Physical Education and a minor in Library Science. Jean then taught one year at Lincoln Elementary School in Dickinson.

Jean met and later married her best friend Delbert Schulte on June 1, 1968 in Beach and to this union four children were born. Jean held teaching jobs in Saltese, Montana for two years, and Conrad, Montana for one year before moving to Billings, where she substitute taught and raised their four children. As a family they moved to Glendive, where Jean started working as a library aide and later became the Librarian at Washington Middle School in the mid 1980's. Jean continued as a Librarian until her retirement in 2008. Following

Jean's retirement, she went on three trips; one to Canada, one to the West Coast and the other for her first airplane ride she flew to Las Vegas, Nevada. Jean enjoyed camping and boating with her family. She loved her dog, Egor and anytime spent with her children and grandchildren was time cherished. She was preceded in death by her parents, Frank and Sally Bares; one brother, Robert Bares; three sisters, Genevieve Bares, Mary Bares and Helen Fischer.
