He was a member of the Sentinel Butte Volunteer Fire Department and received the Fireman of the Year award in 1987. John was a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church and served as treasurer for the church from 1966 to 1990. John enjoyed many hobbies including mechanic work and painting. He was an extremely talented and creative person. Since 1984, John

designed and sold unique paintings on saw blades. He loved being around people. John was preceded in death by his wife Dorothy. John is survived by his sister-in-law, Clara Fakler and a special friend Jack Osterhout both of Beach, North Dakota; and numerous nephews, nieces, and cousins.
