April 10, 1922 - March 24, 2010

Joseph "Joe" Justin Job, age 87, of Beach, North Dakota, formerly of Wibaux, Montana, passed away on Sunday, March 21, 2010, at the Glendive Medical Center in Glendive, Montana. Visitation will be held from 1:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M., Tuesday, March 23, 2010, at the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Wibaux. A Rosary will be held at 7:00 P.M., Tuesday, March 23, 2010, at the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Wibaux. Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10:00 A.M., Wednesday, March 24, 2010, at St. Peter's Catholic Church in Wibaux with Rev. Fr. Jolly Pathiyamoola officiating. Joseph was born April 10, 1922, in Wibaux, Montana, the son of Jacob and Mary Ann (Schall) Job. He was raised and educated in Wibaux. He attended the Eiden Country School through the eighth grade and later earned his G.E.D. Joseph worked on the family farm until joining the United States Navy in December of 1942. He served as a tail gunner in the Phillipines during World War II and was honorably discharged in February of 1946. Joseph worked on a dairy farm in Washington for a couple of years before returning to Wibaux to work with his brother on the family farm. On July 18, 1959, Joseph was united in marriage to Mary Hoose in Eddyville, Iowa. For a time, Joseph was employed with Wagner Plumbing and Heating in Glendive and returned to farming again in 1962. In 1982, he retired from farming and was employed as a sheet metal worker for a few years with the

Burlington Northern Railroad. Joseph enjoyed woodworking and attended church on a regular basis. He was a member of the V.F.W., the Knights of Columbus, and St. Peter's Catholic Church. Joseph was preceded in death by his parents; two infant siblings, Joseph and Elizabeth; a young sister, Margaret; four brothers: John, Jacob, Frank, and Norbert; and five sisters, Eva, Barbara, Monica, Albina, and Elizabeth. Joseph is survived by his wife of 50 years, Mary Job of Beach, North Dakota; his two daughters: Michaella Hajduk and her husband Joseph of Farmington, Minnesota, and Loretta Walsh and her husband David of Farmington, New Mexico; seven grandchildren: Michael, Sarah, Adam, Peter, and Rebecca Hajduk, and Emma and Sam Walsh; his sister, Florentina Worthman of Denver, Colorado; two sisters-in-law: Allene Job of Rock Springs, Wyoming, and Agnes Job of Wibaux, Montana; and numerous nieces and nephews.
