



Larry Goroski

June 5, 1932 - November 1, 2007

Larry Ivan Goroski, age 75, of Glendive, Montana, died Sunday, October 28, 2007 at his home in Glendive. Visitation will be from 9:00 A.M. until 8:00 P.M. Wednesday, October 31, 2007 in the chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral home in Glendive. Funeral services will be held at 11:00 A.M. Thursday, November 1, 2007 at Our Savior Lutheran Church with Pastor Howard Schreibeis officiating. Interment with military honors will be in the Dawson County Cemetery in Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive is entrusted with arrangements. Larry was born in Wibaux, Montana, on June 5, 1932, the son of Leo and Eva (Beeler) Goroski. He received his early education at the Badlands school in Wibaux County and the Ash Coulee school in Fallon County, where he graduated from 8th grade in the spring of 1946, after successfully completing his 8th grade exams in Baker, Montana. Larry worked for Morgan and Oswood Construction of Wibaux before entering the United States Army on October 23, 1952, in Butte, Montana. He served during the Korean War as a wireman and attained the rank of Sergeant. Larry was honorably discharged from the service on October 22, 1954, at Camp Irwin, California, after which he spent 6 years in the Army Reserve. Larry married Marion Tilda Carlson on August 5, 1955, in Baker. Larry and his wife made their home in Glendive since that time. To this union three sons were born, Douglas, Leroy, and Mark. Larry had been employed by a seismograph company and as a laborer for Mountain Bell Telephone, building the telephone lines through Glacier National Park, before going to work on October 5, 1955,

for Mid-Rivers Telephone Cooperative where he remained until his retirement on September 3, 1993. He was a life member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Larry was preceded in death by his parents, and his wife in 2002. Following his wife's death, Larry had done a great deal of volunteer work for Our Savior Lutheran Church and the Our Savior Child Care Ministry. He had also served as a volunteer for the Glendive Medical Center Hospice program and had been a transportation driver to and from the Dawson Community Airport for traveling physicians. Larry loved music, square dancing, hunting, fishing, camping, agate hunting and had raised a garden that was a source of pride year after year. Larry had been instrumental in building the "lighted cross" that still overlooks the city of Glendive. His pride and joy were his children and grandchildren. He is survived by three sons; Douglas Goroski and his wife JoAnn, Leroy Goroski, and Mark Goroski and his wife Toni, all of Glendive; his brother James Goroski and his wife Eileen of Glendive; three grandsons, Bryon Goroski of Colstrip, Montana, Kevin Goroski and his wife Julia of Glendive and Eric Goroski of Bozeman, Montana, one granddaughter, Amanda Jo Goroski of Glendive and an eagerly anticipated, soon to be born, great grandchild; and several nieces and nephews.
