Leo Dale Balcer, age 83, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, October 22, 2013 in Glendive, Montana. Following high school Leo moved to Wahpeton, North Dakota where he participated in football, playing as a quarterback on a championship team for North Dakota State College of Science. He was also very active in basketball, track and tennis. He graduated with the class of 1950. In 1950, Leo enlisted in the United States National Guard and was honorably discharged in 1957. After college, Leo moved back to Glendive where he owned and operated Frosty's In and Out. Leo purchased Frosty's in 1963 from his parents, who began the family ownership of the business in 1955. He owned and operated Frosty's for over 30 years until 2000 when he sold the business to his granddaughter

Bekki Franks and her husband Mark, who continue to extend his legacy as the 3rd generation. Leo continued to work for Bekki and Mark until May of 2013, something he took great pride in and enjoyed every day.

Leo met and later married Mona Arthur on August 15, 1953 and together they raised four children. He was a family man that participated in his children's, grandchildren's and great-grandchildren's events. He was a member of the Cottonwood Country Club, Red Devils Booster Club and Elks Lodge #1324. Leo enjoyed life to the fullest, spending time with family, fishing and golfing. He was preceded in death by his parents, Leo and Lucille Balcer; brother, Tom Balcer and daughter-in-law, Connie Balcer.
