Leo Miske, age 90, of Wibaux, passed away on Wednesday, April 6, 2005 at the Fallon Medical Complex in Baker, Montana. A Vigil service will be held at 7:00 P.M., Friday, April 8, 2005 in the Golden Valley Manor Chapel in Beach, North Dakota. Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 10:00 A.M., Saturday, April 9, 2005 in the St. Philip's Catholic Church in St. Philip, Montana. Rite of Committal will be in the St. Philip's Cemetery in St. Philip, Montana.

Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Wibaux is entrusted with arrangements. Leo was born on April 14, 1914 in Greenbush, Minnesota, the son of Carl and Martha (Duray) Miske. He received his early education in Greenbush. At the age of 12, he moved his family to Montana to a farm south of St. Philip, Montana. In 1937, Leo purchased a farm north of St. Philip which he owned and operated his entire life. Leo married Lenore Maus on September 26, 1939 in the St. Mary's parish in Golva, North Dakota. Leo and his wife were married for 58 years until she preceded him in death on March 29, 1998. Leo had been a resident of the Golden Valley Manor in Beach since 2001. Leo's interests included hunting, farming, fishing and being with his family and friends. He enjoyed collecting tractors and equipment, particularly John Deere. He will be remembered as having given love, joy and generosity to those he loved. Leo was a member of the Knights of Columbus and Dickinson Elks Lodge. He had served as director for the North Dakota Grain Dealers, as a director and President of the Beach Coop Grain Company and on the District #13 School Board. Leo was preceded in death by two sons, Robert in

1959 and Donald in 1982; one granddaughter, Mary Kay in 1964; one grandson, Douglas in 1993; two brothers, Felix and Frank; and three sisters, Martha, Frances and Eleanor. Survivors include two sons, Charles Miske and his wife Lois and Richard Miske and his wife Kimberly, all of Wibaux; three daughters, Roselane "Lani" Wallace and her husband Keith of Billings, Montana, Geralyn Hanson and her husband Ron of Williston, North Dakota, and Marcia Miske of Billings, Montana; his daughter-in-law, Joan Miske of Wibaux; three sisters, Betty Miska, Clara Still and her husband Merton and Helen Guckeen, all of Billings; 11 grandchildren and 8 great grandchildren.
