



## Lori Renae (Zinniel) Seti

April 14, 1964 - June 22, 2013

Butte, Montana: After a long struggle with cancer, Lori Renae (Zinniel) Seti passed away at the age of 49 on Monday, May 27, 2013 at her home in Butte. Memorial services will be held at 10:00 A.M. on Saturday, June 22, 2013 at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Glendive, Montana with Pastor James Hageman officiating. Interment will follow in the Dawson County Cemetery in Glendive. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Glendive has been entrusted with the arrangements. Lori was born in Glendive on April 14, 1964 to Beverly Jean (Kolberg) and Martin Joe Zinniel. Lori was raised in Glendive, and graduated from Dawson County High School in 1982. Lori married John Seti in 1993, received her B.S.N. degree from Minot State University in 1994, and worked as an R.N. at Jamestown Regional Medical Center in Jamestown, North Dakota from 1994 to 2000. After her marriage to John Seti ended in 2001, Lori moved to Butte to work as an R.N. at St. James Healthcare. Lori was preceded in death by her father, Martin Joe Zinniel, her mother, Beverly Jean (Kolberg) Zinniel, and her sister, Joey Lynn (Zinniel) Kline. Lori is survived by the following family members: her nieces, Hannah and Chloe Kline, her nephew, Colby Kline, and her brother-in-law, Coy Kline, all of whom reside in Butte, Montana; her stepfather, Robert Stortz, and her Uncle and Aunt Gordon and Gert Kolberg, all of whom reside in Glendive; her Aunt and Uncle Linda and Lindley Comer, who reside in Elwood, Indiana; her Aunt Margie Ming, who resides in Sidney, Montana; and numerous cousins, stepsisters, and a stepbrother, who reside throughout the state of Montana

and elsewhere. Despite her ongoing health issues, Lori was a vibrant individual who valiantly overcame the obstacles that stood in her way, joyously showered love upon her many family members and friends, and gently nurtured her patients and anyone else who needed tender-loving care. Her feisty, fun-loving nature made Lori memorable to everyone who knew her, and her sympathetic soul endeared Lori to everyone who encountered her. Her nieces and nephew (along with the children of her friends and various family members) were especially dear to Lori's heart. She devoted much of her time to doting on them in every way possible, and was their much beloved "Auntie Lori." The young people whose lives Lori was so involved in will miss her deeply, but it is hoped that they will remember what she taught them and carry on her legacy of love. Lori loved many things in life—writing poetry and acting in stage productions (during her high school years); cooking and baking, gardening, swimming, and singing and dancing (whenever she could); spending time with family and friends and taking care of people and pets (always); and giving advice and directions (to anyone who would listen)—but most of all, Lori simply loved life. No matter what happened to her or to people around her, Lori would always move from tears to laughter; she would always insist that everything would work out in the end.
