Louise Ruth Knuths, age 96 of Glendive, Montana passed away on Monday, May 18, 2026 at the Glendive Medical Center Extended Care in Glendive. Cremation has taken place and no services are planned at this time. Silha Funeral Home of Glendive has been entrusted with the arrangements.

Louise was born on November 6, 1929 in Ashby, Nebraska to her parents Joseph and Iona (Lewis) Shackelford. As a young girl, she moved with her family to Ismay, Montana where she was raised and educated and graduated from Ismay High School with the class of 1948. Following high school, Louise moved to Miles City, Montana where she worked at a grocery store. While there she met Gordon Knuths and they were later married on September 3, 1950 in Miles City and to this union three boys were born. In 1956, the family moved to Terry, Montana where they ranched until 1982 and then ranched south of Miles City until 1988. At that time, they bought a ranch northeast of Glendive where she had remained until moving into GMC Extended Care in February of 2024.

Louise stayed busy raising her family and tending to all of the chores of a ranch wife. She cooked for brandings every year and hauled many a meal out to the cowboys while they were working over the years. She enjoyed long walks, sewing and was very involved with the Cowbells Club.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Joseph and Iona; her husband, Gordon; one infant son, Trent and four brothers, Jim, Frank "Bud", Gail and Richard "Dick" Shackelford.

Louise is survived by two sons, Troy (Donna) Knuths of Glendive and Terry (Kris) Knuths of Ismay; four grandchildren, Casey (Staci) Knuths of Glendive, Kelli (Tyler) Gardner of Ashland, Montana, Amber (Jeff) Campbell of Buffalo, Wyoming and Rusty (Amanda) Knuths of Ismay; six great-grandchildren, Kellan, Brody, Destry, Kane, Beth and Katherine; and numerous nieces and nephews.

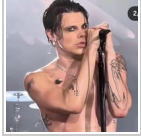
