June 2, 1925 - September 5, 2006

Mabel A. Sampson, age 81, of Glendive, passed away on Friday, September 1, 2006 at the Glendive Medical Center in Glendive, Montana. Visitation will be on Sunday, September 3, 2006 from 3:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M. in the Chapel of the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. Funeral services will be held at 10:00 A.M., Tuesday, September 5, 2006 at Zion Lutheran Church in Glendive with Pastor Avis Anderson officiating. Mabel was born on June 2, 1925 on the family farm, located near Lindsay, Montana, the daughter of Carl Henry and Tillie (Hagen) Christianson. She was raised on the family farm near Lindsay and attended school at Lindsay and graduated from Dawson County High School in Glendive with the class of 1945. She was united in marriage to Milford Sampson on December 18, 1950 in Miles City, Montana. Mabel and her husband made their home in Glendive since that time. Mabel began her nursing career as a nurses aide at the General Hospital in Glendive and later was employed at the N.P. Hospital in Glendive and the Glendive Community Hospital. In 1968, Mabel challenged Montana's Licensed Practical Nursing exams and became a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN). She served as an LPN at the Glendive Community Hospital, the Veterans Administration Hospital in Miles City and the Eastmont Training Center in Glendive until her retirement. Following her retirement, she continued to reside in Glendive until the time of

her death. Mabel sold Watkins products for years. She enjoyed craftwork, and did volunteer work at the Eastern Montana Veterans Home in Glendive. She also served as a volunteer for the Glendive Medical Center Auxiliary by working at the Attic. Mabel was preceded in death by her parents, her husband Milford in December 1981; a daughter-in-law, Susan in 2004 and three brothers, Merlin, Donald and Gaylord.
