Marion was raised and educated in Forsyth, graduating from high school with the class of 1946. After high school she attended college at the U of M in Missoula, Montana. The couple lived in Missoula while Harry finished law school. Upon his graduation, they moved to Harry's home town of Glendive, where she had resided since. Marion worked as a secretary for Harry's Law Office as well as operating the H & M Bar and the Cedar Grill. They sold their bar and restaurant in 1978 and worked primarily in the law

office until 1993 when they retired. Harry preceded Marion in death in 1994. After Harry's death, Marion took time to catch up on old friendships and relaxed after a long working career. She enjoyed spending time with her grandchildren, loved to play cards at the Senior Center, and canning vegetables and jellies. Marion also volunteered for the Glendive Medical Center Ladies Auxiliary and had spent several years as the treasurer. She was also a member of the Veteran's of Foreign Wars Auxiliary and the Daughters of the American Revolution. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband; one brother, John Dowson; and one sister, Francis Atherton.
