Marjorie Eunice Tew Schriver Breitbach, age 90, of Glendive, Montana, passed away on Tuesday, July 8, 2014 at her home in Glendive. I, Marjorie Eunice Tew Schriver Breitbach was born the daughter of Maurice and Hilda (Johnson) Tew in a little homestead shack on North Rock Creek, McCone County, on June 23, 1924. I was the second of five siblings. I was welcomed by my parents and older sister, Mildred who had all moved to the homestead from Minnesota. Later we were joined by brother Jim, sister, Phyllis and brother Don Tew.

As a young girl, I herded sheep for several years, and I think I was a member of HIS flock even then. HE reached out and kept watch over me.

I was married to Ervin Schriver on November 8, 1942, in the St. Francis Xavier Catholic Rectory in Circle, Montana. Martha (Schriver) and Bill Groh were our attendants. Son, Don Schriver was born on September 16, 1943. Son, William A. Schriver was born on January 8, 1947. We were blessed with our son Michael Ervin Schriver who was born with a heart defect. He was with us for only ten day and became our angel in heaven.

Over many years, my family has grown to include Don and his wife, Joyce (Skornogoski) Schriver, their son Jay and Deidra (Berg) Schriver, and children, Dillon and Lauren Schriver; and their daughter Nicole and Terry Knowlton and son, Corey. William A. Schriver and his wife Dolores (Quick) Schriver and daughter Kris (Schriver) and Shawn Brumley and children Chase, Gage, and Jaimie; son Tren and Courtney (Senner) Schriver and daughter Addison Jane; and daughter Chansie (Schriver) and Luke VanDyke and son Spence and Cash.

I was married to Ervin for Forty-four years. He suffered several years with arteriosclerosis. Later I married William Breitbach and we enjoyed twenty-seven good years traveling in our motor home coast to coast. I have always been a "gypsy at heart" so these years have

been very special too.

I am sure you have noticed the hat on my casket spray which has a special meaning in my memory. My first visit to the Catholic Church was with my future Schriver-in-laws. I was the only female in church without something on my head. Since then I have loved to wear hats and now I am many times the only one with a hat on, which does not bother me. A matter of pride??? God, forgive me if this is true.

One of her greatest passions was "Rock Creek", where she would sit for hours on the deck of the cabin just enjoying the view, going for a boat ride or fishing; even if they did not bite.

She was preceded in death by her parents; first husband; one son; two brothers; and two sisters.

Survivors include her husband, William Breitbach; children; grandchildren; great-grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.
