



## Marvin Moen

February 11, 1918 - October 5, 2006

Marvin Arthur Moen, age 88, of Golva, North Dakota passed away on Saturday, September 30, 2006 at the Eastern Montana Veterans Home in Glendive, Montana. Memorial services will be held at 2:00 P.M., Thursday, October 5, 2006 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Beach with Reverend Scott Hojnacki officiating. Interment will follow at Beach Lutheran Cemetery in Beach. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Beach is entrusted with arrangements. Marvin was born on February 11, 1918 in Lake Wilson, Minnesota, the son of Joseph and Inga Moen. Marvin moved to the Carlyle, Montana, area with his parents in 1929. He was confirmed in the Lutheran Church in Carlyle and graduated from Golva High School with the class of 1936. Marvin joined the United States Army on December 4, 1941 and was stationed at Dutch Harbor in the Aleutian Islands. Following his honorable discharge as Staff Sergeant in 1945, he joined his two uncles, John and Pete Hammervold, in raising and showing registered Hereford cattle, winning several trophies and ribbons. He later purchased the ranch from his uncles. Marvin married Lucille Wojahn on June 2, 1954, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Beach, North Dakota. Marvin was a charter member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #4306 in Golva, North Dakota and received his 50 year membership pin. His hobbies included making knives, reading and collecting Western Books. Among his collections were Louis L'amour books and World War II books. Marvin was preceded in death by his parents; his sisters, Irene Finneman and Lilly Sonduck and two uncles, Pete Hammervold and John

Hammervold. Marvin is survived by his wife Lucille of Golva, North Dakota, daughter, Dr. Elaine Moen of Indianapolis, Indiana; his son, Earl Moen of Golva; one niece, Sheila Curl of Bismarck, North Dakota; three nephews, Kevin Finneman of Golva, Jeffery Finneman of Sturgis, South Dakota, and Ronald Finneman of Elko, Nevada; sisters-in-law, Sophie App of Sun City, Arizona and Hilda Wojahn of Aurora, Colorado; two brothers-in-law, Martin Wojahn of Aurora, Colorado and Edwin Wojahn of Dickinson, North Dakota; one great niece, two great nephews and two great great nephews.
