



Neil Wilder Clemmons

November 20, 1910 - January 24, 2009

Neil Wilder Clemmons, age 98, of Redfield, South Dakota, formerly of Glendive, Montana, went to meet his Lord on Monday, January 19, 2009, at the Golden Living Center in Redfield. Visitation will be held from 6:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. on Friday, January 23, 2009 at the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Glendive. The family moved to Savage, Montana, in 1915, where Neil farmed with his father until moving to Glendive where he was employed by Northern Pacific Railroad. Neil married Vyla May Sampson on December 1, 1937, in Glendive. They lived in Glendive for most of their married lives, except for two years when they moved to Hamilton, Montana, and ran a restaurant. Upon their return to Glendive, Neil went back to work for the railroad as a writer-up man for repairs. In September 2002, they moved to the Aberdeen Living Center in Aberdeen, South Dakota. Following 65 years of marriage Vyla preceded Neil in death on September 27, 2003, after which Neil moved to the Golden Living Center in Redfield and had resided since. Neil was a member of Our Savior

Lutheran Church, in which he was instrumental in getting the church started. He was active in Bible study and other church activities. Neil enjoyed fishing, camping with his friends and traveling with his wife. He was preceded in death by his loving wife Vyla, his parents, two sisters and one brother. Survivors include one son, Terry Clemmons and his wife Shirley of Appleton, Wisconsin; one daughter, Sheryl Brown and her husband Gary of Aberdeen; four grandchildren, Shawn (Megan) Brown, Kaydene (Wayne) Hubert, Stacey (Michael) McCarthy, Dawn (Kevin) Hietpas; six great-grandchildren, Rygell, Serana, Ashton and Elijah Hubert, Olivia and Anna Hietpas, Norah McCarthy; and numerous nieces and nephews.
