Norman Henry Jones went to his heavenly home on Christmas Day, 2022. He passed peacefully, surrounded by family. Norm was born on February 19, 1935 to Donald and Alice Jones in Glendive, Montana. He was raised and educated here. Dad joined the Army in 1955 and was honorably discharged in 1958. He served at Fort Knox, Kentucky and in Germany.

In 1960, Norman married Darlene Wirtzfeld and they raised three children together. Dad worked for the United States Postal Service as a carrier and then as the main window clerk. He retired in 2000 after 31 years of service. Dad was an avid bowler his entire life and bowled until he was 85 when the pandemic hit. He also enjoyed hunting agates, making jewelry, searching for antique dishes with mom, and was a voracious reader. Dad was a master gardener and enjoyed sharing the bounty with neighbors and friends. He liked spending time and helping at his in-laws' farm in North Dakota as well.

Norman was preceded in death by his parents, his wife, Darlene, and several sisters-in-law and brothers-in-law. Survivors include his sister, Ethel Scott and her husband Fred Scott of Denver, Colorado; daughter, Dr. Charlotte Jones and her husband Thomas Mendyke of Helena; daughter, Linda Woodward and her husband Jamie Woodward of Parsons, Kansas; and son, Kenneth Jones of Glendive.
