Orville "Uff da" Hendrickson, age 85, of Glendive, Montana died on Tuesday, July 4, 2006 at the Glendive Medical Center. Funeral services will be at 3:00 P.M., Saturday, July 8, 2006 at Zion Lutheran Church in Glendive with Pastor Avis Anderson officiating.
