



Orville Kenneth Moe

March 24, 1917 - March 20, 2017

Orville Kenneth Moe, age 99, of Glendive, Montana, formerly of Beach, North Dakota and Sentinel Butte, North Dakota passed away on Monday, March 20, 2017 at the Eastern Montana Veterans Home in Glendive. A Memorial Service will be held at 10:00 A.M. on Saturday, March 25, 2017 at the Trinity Lutheran Church in Sentinel Butte, North Dakota with Pastor Dana Holter officiating. Interment with full Military Honors will follow services at the Sentinel Butte Cemetery. Silha Funeral Home of Beach has been entrusted with the arrangements.

Orville was born on March 24, 1917 in Beach, a son of Olavus and Christine (Ohnstad) Moe.

Orville attended school in Beach and graduated from Beach High School with the class of 1936.

Orville married Dorthea Wischow on March 17, 1945 at Camp Gordon in Augusta, Georgia. After their marriage, they moved to Sentinel Butte where they farmed with Dorthea's parents before starting their own operation. They raised their family on the farm and then moved into Beach on May 1, 1975. They resided there until moving into the Golden Valley Manor on November 1, 2004. Orville moved to the Eastern Montana Veterans Home on March 18, 2015 and resided there until his passing.

Orville was a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church in Sentinel Butte and a member of the Beach American Legion Club for the past 70 years. He served on several boards including Sentinel Butte Township, SCS and the Water

Commission. Orville was on the board to get water to rural Golden Valley County and helped construct many of the diversion water ways and terraces around Golden Valley County. Orville was not intimidated by anything. In his later years, he learned to operate his computer and keep all kinds of books on it. There wasn't any project he wouldn't take on. Orville was very talented and an excellent woodworker. His projects were always sought after. He was a handyman and could fix anything that was broken. He loved working with his hands.

Orville's family was very important to him and he loved spending time with his children and grandchildren. They will miss him immensely.

Orville was preceded in death by his parents, Olavus and Christine; his wife, Dorthea; a daughter, Darlene Lardy; his sisters, Dee Oech and Myrtle Moe and a brother, Harold Moe.

Orville is survived by his son, Kenneth Moe of Beach; a daughter, Diane (Jerry) Henrikson of Culver, Oregon; seven grandchildren and fourteen great grandchildren.
