



Phillip Wilhelm Siegle

September 20, 1935 - August 20, 2020

Phillip Wilhelm Siegle, age 84, of Wibaux, Montana, passed away on Thursday, August 20, 2020 at the Wibaux County Nursing Home after a short battle with brain cancer. Visitation will be held from 6:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. on Tuesday, August 25, 2020 at the Silha Funeral Home in Wibaux. Funeral services will be held at 11:00 A.M. on Wednesday, August 26, 2020 at the Wibaux County Fairgrounds with Reverend Roger Dieterle officiating. Interment with military honors will be at 2:00 P.M. at the Dawson Memorial Cemetery in Glendive. Silha Funeral Home of Wibaux has been entrusted with the arrangements.

Phil was born on September 20, 1935 to Wilhelm and Martha (Holzworth) Siegle in Glendive, Montana. He received his grade school education at the Yale Country School, Washington Middle School, and graduated with the class of 1955 from Dawson County High School in Glendive. He served in the U.S. Navy for a short time and discharged to be home to help his Dad raising sugar beets on Buffalo Rapids in the Cracker Box area. In 1960 he met the love of his life Evelyn Beck while attending a youth gathering at Trinity Lutheran Church in Billings where she was teaching. They were married on August 13, 1961 in Leigh, Nebraska. They lived on a place near his Dad where he continued farming with him and his brother, Bob. In 1967 they moved to Bradshaw, Nebraska where he worked for a farmer raising corn. In November of 1968 they returned to Montana where they purchased the Roy Amunrud place North of Wibaux. They sold it in 1976 and moved to Wibaux

where they built their house to be closer to school where Evelyn was teaching. Phil started working for Ed Meyer and worked for him for eighteen years when he retired in 1997. He then did lawn care for many in Wibaux besides the lawn at Trinity Lutheran Church. He also started driving the van for the nursing home which he did for many years. He always raised a big garden, sharing veggies with many. He enjoyed playing cards, spending time with his grandchildren and watching wrestling on TV.

Phil was a faithful member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Wibaux where he served as church president for a number of years.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Wilhelm and Martha; daughter, Donna Kearnes in 1994; sisters, Adaline Tallman and Wilma Fulkerson; brothers-in-law, Art Fulkerson and Duane Wold; three nephews, Matthew Siegle, Mark Wold and Steve Wold; and two infant grandsons.

Phil is survived by his wife, Evelyn of Wibaux; his children, John (Teresa) Siegle of Wibaux and Lisa Wentz of Wibaux and Pierz, Minnesota; eight grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; sister, Dolores Wold of Billings, Montana; brothers, Robert Siegle of Glendive, Raymond (Shirley) Siegle of Belgrade, Montana, and David Siegle of Miles City, Montana; and numerous nieces and nephews.
