Glendive, Montana: Reuben Schock, age 88, passed away Saturday, August 6, 2011 with family at his side at the Eastern Montana Veterans Home in Glendive, Montana. Reuben was born on December 23, 1922 in Marsh Montana, one of two sons and one daughter of Christian and Christina (Gaub) Schock. He was raised and educated in Marsh. At the age of eighteen he enlisted in the United States Army and served overseas in defense of this great country during World War II, where he earned the honorable award of a purple heart for being wounded in battle. Reuben married the love of his life Vivian Deckert on December 20, 1954. They had three children; Deanna Kay Schock, Dean Ray Schock, and Denise Renee Schock. He also had three step-children from Vivian's previous marriage, James Howard Hodous, Judith Ann Hodous, and Robert Charles Hodous. They remained happily married until the time of Vivian's death on August 19, 2007. Reuben worked hard at many jobs over his long life. He was a dairy farmer, butcher, and mechanic/tire repairman when he retired from Farmers Union Oil Company in Glendive.

Reuben was preceded in death by his sister, Hilda Boner. Reuben is survived by his daughter, Deanna Boles and her husband Tim Boles of Kalispell and their two children Danielle and Tori Boles; his son, Dean Schock and his wife Tina of Billings and their three children Justin Ludwig, Jessica Watts and her husband Jared, and Joshua Ludwig; his daughter, Denise Park of Rathdrum Idaho and her three children, Kelsey, Seth, and Jamie Park.
