He was stationed in Japan during the Korean War until receiving his honorable discharge in 1950 and returning to Oregon. After Bob returned he went to work at a furniture store and later a book store. During this time he met his one true love Rose Zinsli and they were married August 21, 1954, at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Milwaukee, Oregon. Shortly after which he started his career working for Pacific Northwest Bell.

Bob transferred to Mountain bell in September 1971, and moved the family to Glendive, where he was employed until his retirement in 1984. During his
