July 15, 1920 - April 18, 2012

Wibaux, Montana: Rose F. Gasho, age 91, of Wibaux, formerly of Beach, North Dakota and Trotters, North Dakota, passed away on Friday, April 13, 2012 at the Wibaux County Nursing Home in Wibaux. Visitation will be held from 9:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. and from 6:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. on Tuesday, April 17, 2012 at the Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home in Beach and one hour prior to services at the church. Funeral services will be held at 2:00 P.M. on Wednesday, April 18, 2012 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Beach with Reverend Scott Hojnacki officiating. Interment will follow in the South Side Cemetery near Trotters. Silvernale-Silha Funeral Home of Beach has been entrusted with the arrangements. Rose was born on July 15, 1920 in Anamoose, North Dakota, a daughter of Martin and Anna (Humbradus) Samuel Turnvald. She received her education through the eighth grade at the Funston school in Funston, North Dakota. Rose was baptized and confirmed in the Funston Lutheran Church. After her schooling Rose went to Fargo, North Dakota where she worked for four years during the summers and returned to Anamoose in the winters. After four years of this Rose went to visit her sister, Hilda Metcalf, in Trotters where she found employment with the Stockwell family. It was here that she met her future husband, Chester Gasho. They were married on February 13, 1941 in Glendive, Montana. After their marriage they moved to the Gasho family farm in the Trotters area. To this union three sons and one daughter were born. Rose resided there until moving into the Golden Valley Manor in Beach in 2007 and later the Wibaux

County Nursing Home in 2012. Rose was always a member of a Lutheran church, and for the past several years she was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Beach. Rose and her family appreciated the many times Herb and Marion Chrudimsky took her to church in Beach. She was very passionate about keeping the South Side Cemetery maintained, and always made sure there were flowers on the graves for Memorial Day. Rose was a member of Webbs Willing Workers Homemakers Club. She loved crocheting, raising gardens, playing cards and bingo and visiting with family and friends. Rose loved to travel and extended her travels to include Alaska, Hawaii and twice she went to Europe with a friend. She also visited Canada a number of times to see family and friends. Rose and Chester had spent part of their winters in Arizona. Even after Chester passed away in 1976 she continued to go. It wasn't until most of her friends were gone and the trailer park became filled with strangers that she decided to stay home. Rose was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Chester; four brothers, Emil, Martin, Ernest and Herman Samuels; three sisters, Hilda Metcalf, Hannah Spangler and Frieda Steig and one daughter-in-law, Colleen Gasho. Rose is survived by her four children, Allen Gasho and his wife Betty of Trotters, Muriel Sokoloski and her husband Don of Wibaux, Jerry Gasho and his wife Linda of Brule, Nebraska and Harlan Gasho and his fiancé Sandra, of Trotters; seven grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren.
