Steven L. Mullet, 72, Glendive, died Thursday, January 16, 2025, at the Glendive Medical Center. A final viewing and a visitation time with family will be held Thursday, January 23, 2025, from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM at Silha Funeral Home in Glendive prior to cremation. Silha Funeral Home of Glendive is entrusted with arrangements.

Steven was born July 4, 1952, in Glendive, one of five sons of David “Roy” and Bessie E. (Johnson) Mullet. He spent most of his childhood in Heston, Kansas, and graduated high school there. He then attended Montana State University – Bozeman, graduating with a bachelor’s degree. After spending some time farming in eastern Montana during his first marriage to LaVonne Mullet, he moved to Portland, Oregon. He spent many years working for Navistar Trucking, first doing office work and then moving into sales.

On February 19, 1983, Steven married Phyllis Miller in Portland. The couple moved back to the Mullet’s family farm near Glendive in 1998. He spent the following years raising pulse crops and dabbling in black angus cattle ranching. His life-long love of golf was evident by his frequent use of the course at Cottonwood Country Club in Glendive as well as his family’s own sand green course established on their farm.

Steve will be remembered as a quiet, easy going man by his many friends and

family. He was preceded in death by his parents and his sister-in-law, Teresa Mullet. He is survived by his wife, Phyllis, of Glendive; step-children, Glenn (Celeste) Hall and Nesja (Mike) Stucky; step-grandchildren, Keith, Logan, Maia, and Reid; step-great-grandchildren, Aspen and Monte; and brothers, Dave (Jan) Mullet, Bob (Janie) Mullet, Paul Mullet, Mick (Linda) Mullet.
